



The village of Korme relied on a groundwater spring for all their drinking water. As with many springs, this was often shared with animals and the quality and continued supply was rarely sufficient.

The spring was capped and because the flow rate was sufficient we were also able to construct a cattle trough.



The spring now supplies water to approximately 600 people and 450 head of cattle.

The costs worked out at around £3.20 per person to indefinitely provide clean safe drinking water!

The annual rains were long overdue and many livestock had died. During the inauguration ceremony, the rain finally came but did nothing to dampen the spirits of the local community.
